2 John

This letter was written by John, one of Jesus Christ's twelve disciples. He wrote to an elect lady and her children giving greetings (verses 1-3) and making some specific points (verses 5, 10 & 12). He shows the practical aspect of love towards the Christian brethren (verses 4-6) and warns people to take care over supporting travelling teachers because of the danger of false teaching (verses 7-11).

Questions:

- 1) What does John particularly write about to this unnamed person? See verses 5, 10 & 12.
- 2) What are the main themes in this letter? There are at least four key words repeated three times or more that John has stressed in this letter.
- 3) What is meant by an antichrist? See verse 7.
- 4) What false teaching do you think John has exposed in this letter in verses 7-9?
- 5) What do we understand of who God is in this letter? See verses 3, 7 & 9
- 6) Discuss what our attitude should be to dealing with false teachers. See verses 10, 11)
- 7) Who is "the elect lady and her children" in verse 1?
- 8) What evidence do we see from this letter that John really cares for other believers?
- **9)** How is John greeting the unnamed person? Look carefully at **verse 3**. It is helpful to look up the meaning of the words that John uses in his greetings.
- 10) Does this short letter show us how to grow spiritually? See verses 5, 6 & 9.
- 11) Does John show that some Christians were departing from God? See verses 8-11.
- **12)** Why did John keep his letter short when he could have written much more? See **verse 12**.
